

December School Threat Statistics – Heat Map




- ❖ In December, Courage2Report received a wide range of tips across the state.
- ❖ Many of them were concentrated around Kansas City, Saint Louis, and Springfield.
- ❖ The diverse spread displayed on this map is an indication of good awareness levels for our program and collaboration from schools across Missouri.
- ❖ It also indicates a need for additional awareness and education in northern Missouri



December School Threat Statistics – What was Reported?



Tip Summary: 128 Total



- ❖ Bullying – Repeated Harassment is the most consistently reported tip type. Across 2025, we averaged around 17 Bullying – Repeated Harassment tips per month.
- ❖ Threat to Kill was the most reported last month, but fell to second this month, decreasing from 20 reports last month.
- ❖ There was a significant increase in tips regarding drugs in December. The previous month, there were only 3 tips for drugs.








- ❖ Online Tip Submission remains the primary method for receiving tips.
 - ❖ It includes individuals who used a web browser on a desktop or on their mobile device.
- ❖ Courage2Report offers four tip submission methods. Lower engagement with text and app options may stem from limited awareness or a familiarity with web browsers.
- ❖ Students may also hesitate to report tips through methods that leave a digital trail, such as app downloads or text message records.



December School Threat Statistics - Where was the Concern?




Tips by School Level



- ❖ The high school level had the highest number of tips submitted

- ❖ The most common event type for each level:
 - ❖ Elementary School - Threat to Kill
 - ❖ Middle School - Bullying - Repeated Harassment
 - ❖ High School - Drugs

Individuals Involved by Grade Level



- ❖ School level split is based on K-5, 6-8, and 9-12.
- ❖ If an individual attends a K-8 school, the school level will be categorized according to these designations.




December School Threat Statistics – HandleWithCare (HWC)



- ★ Top three districts for participation:

- ❖ In December, we received **26** HandleWithCare notifications.
- ❖ This heat map shows where schools are utilizing the HandleWithCare program.
- ❖ A 2026 priority is expanding the number of law enforcement agencies trained to use this resource, which enhances student support. HWC also informs school staff when a student has experienced a potentially traumatic event, enabling timely, trauma-informed practices.

Senate Bill 68: Courage2Report Training Requirement and Implementation Timeline

Senate Bill 68 introduced sweeping changes to school operations across Missouri, with a strong focus on safety, preparedness, and student support.

One provision appears in **§170.315.6**, outlines a new requirement related to the **Courage2ReportMO (C2R)** system:

“Public schools shall actively foster an environment in which students feel comfortable sharing information they have regarding a potentially threatening or dangerous situation with a responsible adult. As part of each public school's efforts to actively foster such environment, each public school shall annually provide age-appropriate information and training on the Missouri state highway patrol's Courage2ReportMO (C2R) reporting mechanism or its successor reporting mechanism.”

- ❖ This requirement **will not take effect during the 2025–2026 school year**. Instead, it is scheduled for implementation in the **2026–2027 school year**.
- ❖ C2R staff are producing age-appropriate training for schools to meet this requirement.




How many school shootings in 2025? - K-12 School Shooting Database



The end of 2025 brings a final count of **232 shootings** at K-12 schools with **204 victims** who were killed or wounded.
